






Concept	Practice
external information collection that aids	Notes linked with bi-directional
thinking and memory	[[backlinks]]

related concepts: <u>Personal Knowledge Management (PKM)</u>, wiki, Zettelkasten, digital gardening, life operating system, "Linking your Thinking"





Juggling projects

Learning something new can be intimidating

Disparate sources: Slack, emails, bookmarks, notes, etc

Googling repeatedly (but...sites go down)

Are we able to make notes and discover them without too much friction?

## Second brain benefits

- Solidify knowledge
- Readily search and share ideas
- Consolidate and reduce clutter (<u>collector's fallacy</u>)
- Structure emerges from links within notes, not directories

#### About backlinks:

Weblinks are uni-directional - the destination has no knowledge of the source that linked to it. **Backlinks are bi-directional - the destination links back to all of its sources.**

### Experiment to find *your* way


collect -> synthesize -> manage

Make a habit of connecting as much as you can

creative synthesis: new ideas form effortlessly from linked ideas

## Compound growth

In  $\sim$ 6 months, work/personal second brains: 870 backlinks in 226 files. >50 article highlights,  $\sim$ 12 book takeaways, weekly micro-blogging

- You might instead like Obsidian, logseq, Notion, Roam, etc.


